I would just like to give you a little update on Middle School Math. I am proud to say that right now 5th grade is leading the way with a class average of 90%, which is an A-. Awesome job, and keep up the hard work!!! The students are learning a variety of concepts. This week in 5th grade, we have begun multi-digit multiplication, which can be a challenging concept. Sixth grade is working with fractions. We have added them, subtracted them, multiplied, and divided them. I told them we can even eat them by dividing up some pizza pies if they can work hard to bring up their class average. 7th grade is working on everything



from graphing expressions in algebra to completing proofs for geometry. Eighth grade, I believe, is being challenged more than they have in math in a long time.
